President Tom Shipley Strengthens Holy Angels for Generations to Come

In December 2023, President Tom Shipley announced his plans to retire from his position effective June 2024. After thirteen years at AHA, he is the longest-tenured high school president within the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis. Tom has shown an unparalleled, steadfast commitment to the mission of private, Catholic education.

Tom began his teaching career in Libertyville, IL, progressing to assistant principal and then principal at Libertyville Public Schools. After 13 years, Tom returned to his hometown of Madison, WI as principal and later as president of Edgewood Catholic High School. In 2011, Tom and his wife Beth moved to Minnesota where he assumed the role of president at Academy of Holy Angels.

Known for his strong business acumen, Tom brought robust executive leadership, fundraising, and institutional finance skills to his role at Holy Angels, as well as a forward-leaning vision for the school. Under his leadership and direction, the school has:

- Completed two successful comprehensive capital campaigns that raised over \$15 million;
- Established the school's first permanent endowment in 2014, which has grown to over \$5 million;
- Increased the compensation and benefits and provided additional retirement savings options for all staff;
- Added a second turf field and dome in 2019 making AHA the only private school in the country with two full-sized domed athletic fields; opened the new iCenter for STEM Education in 2022, renovated 25 classrooms, and many other facility upgrades;
- More than tripled AHA's annual giving program, from \$600,000 to \$2 million a year;
- Doubled the amount of tuition assistance available, providing opportunities for many new families to attend AHA;
- Retired more than \$14 million of long-term debt, positioning the school to be debt-free as of January 2024.

What these data points don't capture is the human element of Tom's leadership. Staff members have consistently commented on his compassionate, pastoral approach to challenging issues - including the difficult task of leading AHA through the pandemic - as well as his ability to cultivate a fun and focused staff culture. The combination of overall institutional improvements and the interpersonal touch has played a significant role in AHA being named a Star Tribune 'Top Workplace' for seven consecutive years, a designation that is based solely on employee survey results.

"Serving as president and being able to lead Holy
Angels has been an amazing and special gift," Tom
Shipley shared. "From leading our community through
unprecedented times, strengthening the school's
financial foundation, initiating an endowment,
retiring the debt, expanding academic and athletic
facilities, and establishing the framework of the
school's strategic plan, I am incredibly proud of what
we have been able to accomplish. We have doubled

our financial assistance for families and taken major strides in rewarding our faculty and staff in our salaries and benefits offerings. My tenure as president at Holy Angels has been a labor of love and a family commitment for Beth and me."

As a culmination of Tom's leadership, Academy of Holy Angels was deemed a 2021 School of Distinction from Cognia, a global accreditation agency. AHA was one of only 59 schools in the world to receive this honor.

Board Chair Yvonne Houle-Gillard said, "We want to thank Tom for his leadership, dedication, and commitment to AHA these past thirteen years. He is leaving AHA strongly positioned for the future, and we are forever grateful to him. We ask for God's blessings upon Tom and Beth as they start writing the next chapter in their lives. We will forever treasure their friendship and support of AHA."

Coach LaMere '99 shared, "It was an incredible season and another huge step for our program in the quest to win a State Championship. The Holy Angels community and its support for our team was amazing. Congratulations to our players and families on a memorable season. We will be back!"



Madeline Wood and Alaina DeCrans, both seniors, won the Minnesota State High School Table Tennis Team Championship! The competition was hosted at AHA on February 25. A second team, Ava Telep, Ingrid Kuhfuss, Claire Kuntz and Elli Marso, won the consolation championship. Said Jean-Luc Roche, table tennis moderator, "They played their hearts out with great sportsmanship. We can be proud of all of them."



After 31 years of teaching (21 years at Holy Angels), Mr. Jean-Luc Roche will retire this June. Mr. Roche, who was born in Morocco and moved to Minnesota in 1988 to attend college, has taught French for his entire career. He's held other roles at AHA including moderating the table tennis club and SADD, a student version of Mothers Against Drunk Driving. Principal Heidi Foley shared, "C'est magnifique que Monsieur soit professeur à l'AHA. What a gift to AHA students and staff to have a native French speaker. But more, Monsieur Roche is, and always will be, our treasured colleague." When asked what he plans to do upon his retirement, Mr. Roche shared, "So far, I have not decided what is going to be the next step in my life!" The Math League exists to identify students who have unusual mathematical ability, to give them recognition and encouragement, to bring them together with similarly gifted students for mutual stimulation, and to encourage them to investigate a study of topics not commonly taught in the high school curriculum.





The Triple 'A' Award honors high school seniors who are outstanding participants in academics, athletics, and the arts. Academically, Marina excels; she has taken nine advanced placement courses and has earned the Scholar of Distinction honors level all three eligible years. In the arts, Marina's interests include band (clarinet), drumline, jazz band, marching band, and theater. In athletics, Marina has participated in cross country, track and field, and Nordic skiing, where she served as a team captain.

Academy of Holy Angels Names New President

Welcome, Dr. David Sorkin



On March 13, the Academy of Holy Angels Board of Trustees announced the appointment of Dr. David Sorkin as the school's new president, effective July 1, 2024. Dr. Sorkin comes to AHA with significant leadership experience in Catholic education, most recently as the head of school at Saint Hubert Catholic School in Chanhassen, MN. During his time there, David increased enrollment to the highest levels in school history, demonstrated fiscal stewardship to eliminate a cash flow deficit, and implemented culturally responsive welcoming strategies for Spanish-speaking students. He began his career as a music teacher at Saint Agnes in St. Paul and served as teacher and dean of students at Providence Academy in Plymouth before becoming assistant principal at Seton Catholic Preparatory High School in Arizona.

Dr. Sorkin was a national adjunct faculty member at the University of Notre Dame, where he taught graduate-level executive leadership courses designed to align organizational priorities with mission objectives. He is also a research fellow at Boston College, and his qualitative research study on the response of urban, Catholic school principals to the COVID-19 pandemic was presented at the 2022 American Education Research Association national conference and published in the Journal of Catholic Education (Fall 2023). Dr. Sorkin has a Bachelor of Music from St. Olaf College, a Master of Arts in Educational Administration from the University of Notre Dame, and a Doctorate of Education in Leadership and Innovation from Arizona State University.

This appointment is the culmination of a seven-month, nationwide search by the Academy of Holy Angels Board of Trustees Search Committee, led by Chair Yvonne Houle-Gillard and Past Chair Fr. Mike Tix. The Board was pleased to partner with Gayle Stoffel, Associate Director of Catholic Schools for the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis, who provided expertise and guidance throughout the process.

Dr. Sorkin shared, "I am thrilled to join Academy of Holy Angels, and I am excited to partner with the faculty, staff, students, parents, alumni, and friends of AHA to continue strengthening the excellence found within this amazing community. Since 1931, AHA has proudly served as a beacon for Catholic secondary education, and together, we will ensure Holy Angels continues to be that shining light for the families and students we serve."

Outside of school, David's interests include international travel, food and culture, music, college football, and Caribou Coffee. David, his wife Kelly, and their two sons attend Pax Christi in Eden Prairie.

After thirteen years, Mr. Tom Shipley will retire from his current position as president on June 30, 2024. Dr. David Sorkin will begin his role as president on July 1, 2024. The two will work together throughout the month of July to ensure a smooth transition. In the months ahead, there will be opportunities for the community to meet and get to know Dr. Sorkin.

Campus Ministry Team – A Uniquely Holy Angels Experience

Campus Ministry Team, or 'CMT' as it's commonly called, began as an extracurricular club at Holy Angels in the early 2000s. Today, it's developed into the capstone theology course. What makes this class unique to AHA is that it is rare for a school to have a year-long class dedicated solely to campus ministry; other high schools either outsource pieces of the program or offer it as an after-school activity.

Each year, approximately 50 senior students are selected to CMT through an application process. When asked why the class requires an application, Ms. McComas-Bussa shared, "We want students who really want to be a part of this. While this isn't an advanced placement theology class, this is our closest version of it. It requires a significant amount of dedication and a willingness to model the Catholic faith in and out of the classroom."

CMT empowers students to minister in the areas of faith, service, and pastoral care to help enhance the spiritual life for the AHA community. This includes liturgy, prayer, service, retreat-planning, faith-sharing, outreach, and Christian leadership.

The class is co-led by theology teachers Ann McComas-Bussa and Mark Schumacher. What is evident to them is the growth in leadership and confidence that they witness in their students. Mr. Schumacher shared, "The students appreciate how much work goes into planning events – whether it's Mass, retreats, or a simple prayer service. They grow in their understanding and in those skills." Ms. McComas-Buss added, "Our

CMT students learn so many leadership skills that are transferable to college. I can just imagine one of them as a college freshman - being able to easily initiate a small group conversation, lead a game, and speak comfortably in front of others. These are skills that they'll use for the rest of their life!"

The entire student community benefits from CMT. Mr. Schumacher said, "The value of this program is that it's not teachers leading everything; peer-to-peer ministry in this format is really powerful." Ninth graders receive CMT mentors, meeting weekly during homeroom. During that time, the CMT students share tips for new students, what to expect at school events, how to prep for finals, and more. They serve as a trusted voice to the ninth graders in order to establish a positive school culture all four years.

This spring, CMT students will attend the annual etiquette brunch, where Principal Foley shares a formal meal in the Parlor with them, teaching proper dining etiquette, interview preparation, and social graces. The year culminates in May with a party and a 'passing of the torch' ceremony, when the senior CMT students welcome the newest CMT members (current juniors).

A Love Story's Lasting Legacy


My mother Mary Rocheford
Mulheran was a proud member of
the AHA Class of 1938. She was
active with her friends in many of the
school's activities, sports, clubs, and
especially in the musicals. She loved
Holy Angels! The principal then
was Sister Angèle, C.S.J. Mary soon
became aware that Joe Mulheran, the
boy she was dating from DeLaSalle
High School, was the nephew of her
school principal!

In those days, it was common for DeLaSalle boys to join the Holy Angels theater department to be cast in the male roles. In one play, Mary, a beauty inside and out, and her




